COUNTY RANGER

COUNTY RANGERS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL FORESTRY MANAGEMENT AND PROGRAMS WHICH TAKE PLACE WITHIN THE COUNTY THEY ARE LOCATED.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Supervise all forestry programs, which includes the following:
 - Forest fire control focusing on the prevention and suppression of forest fires
 - Provide technical advice on topics such as insects, disease, tree planting and harvesting to landowners
 - Prepare forest management plans
 - Lead forestry education activities and presentations to school and civic groups, as well as work with local media
- Supervise and train employees
- Administer forest management guidelines and serve as forest law enforcement and protection

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

- Graduation from a two year technical school with an Associates Degree in Forest Management, or an Environmental/Natural Science Curriculum
- Four years of related experience in forestry services
