INDUSTRY FORESTERS MANAGE PRIVATE FORESTED LANDS FOR TIMBER COMPANIES IN ORDER TO MAKE A FINANCIAL RETURN THROUGH SILVICULTURE PRACTICES.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Develop good harvest and silviculture prescriptions, which may include:
 - Thinning and clearcutting of timber
 - Road and ditch maintenance on property
 - Fertilization
 - Weed control
 - Tree planting and reforestation
 - Prepare sites for new trees using chemical and mechanical methods
- Partner and build relationships with various stakeholders and interest groups
- Negotiate and manage contracts for harvesting, management, and leaseholders
- Plan and supervise all forest activities and user groups that occur in the forest

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

- Graduation from a four year school in a preferred field
 - Advanced degrees needed for executive roles
- Experience needed will vary based on position
